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For foodies

AlUla has a growing restaurant and dining scene, from casual to fine dining options.

Located at the entrance of the wadi near the oasis is the Pink Camel – a café and traditional sweet and pastry bakery. The café is made from traditional wooden architecture, and with terrace-style seating, patrons can sit outside and enjoy the shaded surrounds and the perfume of millions of palms.

Located in the heart of AlUla Old Town is Suhail, a high-end Saudi Arabian dining concept serving dishes inspired by the old Arabian Peninsula and time-honoured traditions, matched with a modern twist and exemplary service.

Opening in October 2021 is Maraya Social

by Jason Atherton. This will be AlUla's first restaurant by a Michelin star chef. Think exquisite dishes created to pair with AlUla's unique nature and beauty.

The plentiful supply of water from the oasis, enables plants and crops to flourish in AlUla, including barley, wheat, oat, figs, olives, citrus fruits, herbs and, of course, dates. The most famous date is the sweet and sticky, yet highly nourishing, barni date. Citrus fruits are also bountiful – there are 29 varieties in total. Look out for sweet lemons and kumquats (referred to locally as maliki). At AlWadi Farm, you can take a tour with a local farmer and pick your own fruits and enjoy the on-site restaurant.









Vaccination opens up USA

The rapid roll-out of COVID-19 vaccinations in the USA has seen the Centers for Disease Control update its travel guidance for American citizens, who are being told it is safe for those who have had a jab to travel across the country without quarantine.

For international travel, US citizens are also now unrestricted but must obtain a negative COVID-19 test result before boarding their flight back to America.

The ruling has given hope that Australia might also relax its restrictions once the vaccination program gets back on track, but in the meantime the highly anticipated New Zealand travel bubble has also finally been approved, with quarantine-free trans-Tasman travel in both directions starting from next Monday.

Australian Health Protection
Principal Committee with
developing a risk profile and
timelines which would allow
vaccinated Aussies to travel
overseas.


More cruise lines restart

Silversea Cruises has joined the ranks of global cruise lines recommencing operations, with its brand new *Silver Moon* to operate in Greece from June this year.

The company is requiring passengers to be vaccinated, similar to new protocols announced by Norwegian Cruise Line which has announced its planned resumption in Greece and the Caribbean from 25 July.

Viking Cruises is expanding its footprint after selling out new UK voyages aboard its new Viking Venus in just one week, with new departures in Iceland and Bermuda, while fledgling cruise line Virgin Voyages has announced its flagship Scarlet Lady will make her debut in England.

The Virgin offering, for vaccinated UK citizens only, will feature "short and sweet" staycation-style sailings.



Arabia's hidden treasure

It's not very often that you get the chance to be one of the first people to travel to a brand new destination, let alone one that is as beautiful as AlUla, writes Sarah Beyer.





AlUla is a city in the north west of Saudi Arabia and for the first time is open to travellers, revealing 200,000 years of human history to discover. Tourism is at the heart of Saudi Arabia's 2030 Vision to create a thriving economy through diversification, and the Kingdom is encouraging travellers to come and visit.

AlUla is one of the first destinations to be opened up, and travellers to the city can discover an ancient landscape where time has stood still. The heritage and culture of this destination is fascinating, and visitors to the city will be warmly welcomed by the people,

the elders, the rawi (Arabic storytellers) and tour guides.

Heritage

AlUla is a must-visit destination for discerning travellers seeking meaningful, authentic travel experiences. There are traces of many civilisations who have built AlUla over the millennia, from the capital of the kingdom of Dadan to the trading hub of the Nabataeans into the Islamic era. Much of AlUla's epic rock formations, valley and sandy desert remains as an untouched expanse, with discoveries yet to be made to add to its rich and layered past.

The most well-known and recognised site in AlUla is Hegra, Saudi Arabia's first UNESCO World Heritage Site. A 52-hectare ancient city, Hegra was the southern capital of the Nabataean Kingdom dating back to the first century BCE. Today visitors will find more than 100 well preserved tombs with elaborate facades carved from rock formations.

Centuries older than
Hegra, is Ancient Dadan,
one of the most developed
1st millennium BCE cities
of the Arabian Peninsula.
Dadan controlled the ancient
caravan trade routes. A
highlight of Dadan are the
famed Lion Tombs. While

nearby Jabal Ikmah, often referred to as the 'open-air library', offers insights into ancient beliefs, rituals and practices of every-day life. In many ways Jabal Ikmah was the ancient Arabian version of Twitter!

AlUla Old Town is overlooked by Musa bin Nusayr Castle, a citadel dating back to at least the 10th century. Old Town is where pilgrims, travellers and permanent settlers congregated through the ages. Today visitors can explore the labyrinth of mud brick buildings, go on a journey through the town with a rawi, explore the bazaar, watch live reenactments, learn traditional handicrafts, browse the shops for spices, dates and pottery.

Nature

As well as incredible history, AlUla is a place with stunning natural landscapes. The oasis runs like a river though the centre of town, with 20km of palm trees and local farms with citrus and fruit trees where you can visit and enjoy a long leisurely lunch of local produce.

The desert surrounds of the city are also full of natural wonders. Rock formations like Elephant Rock, Face Rock, and Dancing Rocks are a photographer's dream. You can book a walking, cycling or horseback riding tour to best appreciate these canyons and mountains.

Those looking for a wildlife encounter should visit

Sharaan Reserve where you might spot an ostrich, ibex or gazelle, and you can learn about conservation efforts to restore native gazelles and the Arabian leopard to their natural habitat.

Arts and Culture

AlUla is blessed with natural and man-made art on a monumental scale. From contemporary artists projecting light against the rocks to locals studying traditional handicrafts, the spirit of the arts lives on in the valley of AlUla.

At the forefront of AlUla's arts and culture scene is Maraya, one of the world's architectural wonders.

Maraya which means mirror in Arabic is a concert hall and events centre covered in



over 9,000m² of mirrors reflecting the desert surroundings. Surrounded by mountains Maraya's brilliance combines both modernism and antiquity.

A new handicraft pavilion at AlUla Old Town will provide an insight into the crafts and arts practiced by the residents of the town over generations. In addition to the traditional arts. contemporary artists are finding creative ways to express themselves across AlUla's extraordinary landscape including exhibitions, installations and galleries that celebrate AlUla's distinct artistic heritage.

Adventure


AlUla's heritage doesn't mean you can't experience the city in a modern way, with plenty of adventure activities which interact with the backdrop of the area's landscape. Travellers of all fitness levels can hike and bike around various sites, and vintage car transfers between attractions is a great novelty. Getting an aerial view of AlUla is a fantastic way to experience the city and visitors can head to the skies in a vintage aircraft or helicopter, or even a hot air balloon in season.

Travelling there

AlUla's International Airport is a short flight (only 1.5 hours) from Riyadh or Jeddah which are serviced by many airlines flying from Australia. If you've had enough of flying once you get to the Middle East, you can road trip from Petra in Jordan in 6 hours, from Jeddah in 7 hours and Riyadh in 10 hours.

When it comes to accommodation, there are a range of options available in AlUla from self-catered RV resorts to eco-hotels and luxury desert suites, with more coming online between this year and 2023.


Star-gazing

AlUla's vast desert landscape and dark skies provide an idyllic location for star-gazing. Book an evening tour at Al Gharameel, where you can get comfortable sitting on a traditional carpet as local storytellers point out constellations relating to the local culture. It is a humbling and breathtaking experience to look out at the pitch-black sky smothered in brilliant stars, against the thin sandstone pillars of Al Gharameel. The best time for star-gazing is around each new moon.



The people of AlUla have long been lauded for their warmth and hospitality. Historically vital crossroads along the famous incense-trading routes, AlUla's oases provided a welcome respite for caravans of weary travellers. Today, the people of AlUla, the elders, the rawi (Arabic storytellers), the craftspeople and tour guides are excited to welcome back visitors and to share their stories and unveil some of the secrets this vast untouched landscape.





Experience Elephant Rock

Climbing three stories high, Elephant Rock (Jabal Alfil) is one of AlUla's most recognisable natural sites. As the light changes in the afternoon, no two visits are the same. For an experience like no other, take a seat in the stylish sunken booths at the foot of the rock formation, sip Arabic coffee and enjoy local sweets as you watch the wonder of nature.

Archaeology - The world's oldest domestic dog

Archaeological excavations continue in AlUla. Recently, evidence of the oldest domestic dog, dating back to 4th millennia BCE was discovered. pre-dating other examples by more than 1,000 years. The researchers found the dog's bones in a burial site that is one of the earliest monumental tombs identified in Arabia. The ongoing archaeological work in AlUla is a great source of interest globally and as more details are revealed, is anticipated to change the current understanding of the significance of the Arabian Peninsula.





Shaden Resort




Icon under a microscope
